Canfield Soccer Club has a competitive organization for Canfield soccer players ages 8-14. Teams are divided into girls and boys teams.

Tryouts: They will take place between June 14 and July 1st. A competitive coach will contact you about tryouts either by email or phone call. All players who wish to try out for a team must register through this link shown above. You will not be charged any money until your child has been selected for a team.

The coach will keep between 9 and 18 players depending on the age group. A prospective player should attend all tryouts, **even if they were on the team the year before.** Teams are age related and there is no moving up age groups. Age groups consist of U-9, U-10, U-11, U-12, U-14, U-15.

NO PLAYERS MAY VOLUNTARILY TRY OUT AT AN OLDER AGE GROUP.

Players may double roster with consent of their age appropriate coach. A player whom is cut can attempt to get on an older team if there is room on the roster. However the following year, they must tryout for their age appropriate group. In event there are age groups combined due to lack of numbers, Coaches decisions are final on who will be rostered. ***If a player does not live in Canfield, the player can still play competitive soccer for the Canfield Soccer Club.*** Generally 75 % of a team **must be** from Canfield **unless** there is a shortage of players **or** if players are returning from a previous year.

No players may be named to teams prior to the conclusion of tryouts on July 1st.

Practices: They are usually held two days a week and last from 1½ - 2 hours. Most teams start practicing in July. Practices last through the season which ends at

the beginning of November. CSC recommends players who make the team be willing to make a firm commitment to their team's practices and games.

Games: They start around Labor Day. Games are played against other communities with similar age groups. Sometimes age groups are combined when there are too few teams. This mostly happens at the U-10 age group where U-9 teams play against U-10 teams also. Canfield Soccer Club belongs to the YAYSL (Youngstown Area Youth Soccer League). More information can be found at their website: <http://www.yayssl.org/>. Teams generally enter 1 or 2 tournaments in the Fall as well. This depends on the coaches. Traveling for league games is local in the Youngstown area. Tournaments may be further away.

Fees: The cost for 2010 is \$ 185.00 per child (***No discounts for siblings***). Each team will be responsible for their own uniforms which may include shorts and a jersey. This will increase the cost to players, but each player keeps their jersey, shorts and socks. They may be used in consecutive years. Teams may get sponsors for their team, but ***must*** also have Canfield Soccer Club on their uniforms. A Soccer Camp put on by Canfield High School players is included in the fees. The dates are August 2-6th. Times will be announced by Canfield High School Staff. Once you make a team, you will be billed by the club through the internet. Once you pay, there are ***NO REFUNDS***, so be sure you want to pay to play.

Uniforms:** New this year to CSC, all teams on the boys and girls sides of CSC will be wearing the same style of uniforms. The uniform will include two (2) jerseys, two (2) pairs of socks, and one (1) pair of shorts. The uniforms will be selected by a joint decision of the Vice Presidents for the boys and girl divisions. ***There will be no exceptions to this rule.*

Coaching: Starting in 2011 the YAYSL has mandated that all coaches must be certified with a licensing course offered by **Ohio North**, the sanctioning organization of the YAYSL. Teams have a limit of 3 coaches maximum per team. Coaching classes can be found at the Ohio North web site. <http://www.oysan.org/Coaches/coach.htm>. Costs of coaching classes are reimbursed by the YAYSL after the season. Any parent wishing to coach may sign up online or contact Frank Mancini at coachmancini@yahoo.com. Generally, coaches follow their teams through the age groups as they get older. In the U-9 and U-10 age division, new coaches are sometimes hard to find. If there is not a certified coach, there may not be team. Coaches have the responsibility of holding tryouts, updating rosters and paperwork, entering teams in tournaments and a desire to increase their study of soccer by gravitating to the more experienced

coaches in the club. Coaches should fill out an application and complete the on-line Risk Management Statement. If you have problems with the coach please refer to Problem Resolution Soccer at the website prior to contacting the League President.
